### Old Testament: Isaiah

But there shall be no more gloom for her who was in anguish. In the former time, he brought into contempt the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali; but in the latter time he has made it glorious, by the way of the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the nations. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. The light has shined on those who lived in the land of the shadow of death. You have multiplied the nation. You have increased their joy.

### New Testament: Matthew

Leaving Nazareth, Jesus came and lived in Capernaum, which is by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken through Isaiah the prophet, saying,

“The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali,  
toward the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the  
Gentiles,  
the people who sat in darkness saw a great light;  
to those who sat in the region and shadow of death,  
to them light has dawned.”

Jesus went about in all Galilee, teaching in their  
synagogues, preaching the Good News of the  
kingdom, and healing every disease and every  
sickness among the people. The report about him  
went out into all Syria. They brought to him all who  
were sick, afflicted with various diseases and  
torments, possessed with demons, epileptics, and  
paralytics; and he healed them.
